

Greetings All,

We want to make sure that you are all aware of changes to the Paycheck Protection Program program that go into effect today, February 24th. These changes are an effort to ensure the smallest businesses that may have been left behind in previous relief efforts are getting assistance.

The following changes are going into effect:

- For a fourteen day period beginning February 24th, only businesses with fewer than 20 employees will be able to apply for the PPP loan program.
- Revise the loan calculation formula for sole proprietors, independent contractors and self-employed individuals to allow them to receive more help, establishing a \$1B set aside for businesses in these categories in low to moderate income areas.
- Eliminate the exclusionary restriction that prevents small business owners with a prior non-fraud felony convictions from obtaining relief through the PPP.
- Eliminate the restriction that excludes small business owners who are delinquent on their student loans from obtaining relief through the PPP.
- Allow lawful resident non-citizen small business owners to use their Individual Taxpayer Identification Numbers (ITIN) to apply for relief.

<u>Here</u> is the White House press release on these changes. Remember that PPP applications go through banks, so contact your bank to learn about their application process.

We will send additional information on this as it becomes available. Also, watch for an email announcing our move to the Dayton Innovation Hub.




