
In the month of January County Corp funded a real estate purchase for Select Signs, LLC. This growing business utilized the State Regional 166 loan program and locked in a fixed interest rate of 3.00% for 20 years on 40% of the purchase price.

Also in January the State approved another Regional 166 loan for Spradlin Bros. Welding in Springfield for the purchase of a new laser cutting machine. This is Spradlin's second State 166 loan through County Corp. They understand the value of locking in a below market fixed interest rate when financing equipment. Spradlin will benefit from a 10 year fixed rate of 3.20%.

Interest Rate Update

For the third month in a row SBA's 20 and 25 year note rate has dropped, this time to 3.314% and 3.492% respectively. But will this continue? In January the Federal Reserve voted unanimously not to raise the benchmark federal funds rate in January, this after a 25 basis points increase in December. For now it appears the Fed Committee will remain patient as it considers future adjustments but it is assumed that 2019 will see some type of interest rate increase. The question is when and how much!




