If you are looking for ways to get the word out to your community about the importance of answering the Census, the Dayton-Montgomery County Complete Count Census 2020 team wants to provide you with weekly tools to help you communicate with your community!

Feel free to adjust any of these to fit your community's style/interests. This is a tool to help get the word out about the impact of the Census on the services we can provide to residents and businesses over the next ten years.

People can now fill out their Census responses online at <u>https://my2020census.gov/</u> or call 844-330-2020. If you don't respond to the Census online or by phone, a paper copy will be mailed to your home.

- <u>Web Article</u> Avoiding Census 2020 Scams
 Census 2020 is the first time citizens can be counted electronically. The information you provide is protected and secure, but be aware of scammers who may use the census as a tool to steal your personal information.

It's important to remember that the Census Bureau will never send unsolicited emails and will never ask for your social security number, bank or credit card numbers, or money/donations of any kind.

Phishers may pose as census officials to try and steal your information by directing you to a website that looks real but is infected with malware. The Census Bureau only has two websites - Census.gov and 2020Census.gov. If you receive any information or links listing a census.com or .net, etc., it is not a valid website.

This also applies if someone comes to your home to collect a response. They will have a valid I.D. badge with a photo that has a U.S. Department of Commerce watermark and an expiration date. They will not ask you for your social security number, bank or credit card numbers and ask for money/donations of any kind. If you are still concerned about their identity, please call 800-923-8282 and a representative from the Census Bureau will confirm or deny the surveyor.

Census 2020 is safe and the information you provide directly impacts federal funding amounts and the number of elected officials our community has. If you have any questions about how to fill out the census or how to avoid scams, please visit Census.gov, or call 800-923-8282.

Coronavirus (COVID-19)

SBA Disaster Assistance in Response to the Coronavirus

The U.S. Small Business Administration is offering designated states and territories lowinterest federal disaster loans for working capital to small businesses suffering substantial economic injury as a result of the Coronavirus (COVID-19). Upon a request received from a state's or territory's Governor, SBA will issue under its own authority, as provided by the Coronavirus Preparedness and Response Supplemental Appropriations Act that was recently signed by the President, an Economic Injury Disaster Loan declaration.

- Any such Economic Injury Disaster Loan assistance declaration issued by the SBA makes loans available to small businesses and private, non-profit organizations in designated areas of a state or territory to help alleviate economic injury caused by the Coronavirus (COVID-19).
- SBA's Office of Disaster Assistance will coordinate with the state's or territory's Governor to submit the request for Economic Injury Disaster Loan assistance.
- Once a declaration is made for designated areas within a state, the information on the application process for Economic Injury Disaster Loan assistance will be made available to all affected communities as well as updated on our website: SBA.gov/disaster.
- SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loans offer up to \$2 million in assistance and can provide vital economic support to small businesses to help overcome the temporary loss of revenue they are experiencing.
- These loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable and other bills that can't be paid because of the disaster's impact. The interest rate is 3.75% for small businesses without credit available elsewhere; businesses with credit available elsewhere are not eligible. The interest rate for non-profits is 2.75%.
- SBA offers loans with long-term repayments in order to keep payments affordable, up to a maximum of 30 years. Terms are determined on a case-by-case basis, based

upon each borrower's ability to repay.

- SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loans are just one piece of the expanded focus of the federal government's coordinated response, and the SBA is strongly committed to providing the most effective and customer-focused response possible.
