***IMPORTANT CHANGES ***

Because of state mandates on youth program funding, Montgomery County YouthWorks Summer Employment Program is transitioning to <u>Youth</u>

<u>Career Services 365 (YCS365)</u>, a Comprehensive Case Management and Employment Program (CCMEP). **YCS365** is a year-round program that begins with the YouthWorks summer program and provides options for work experience in the fall, winter, and spring months. Each YouthWorks participant will also attend two-weeks of paid education/training and participate in eight weeks of work experience during each term.

*Important changes have been made to the program and the application process

Who is eligible?

- **4** 14 to 18 years old (must be 14 at the time of application)
- Low-income households Above income youth are encouraged to apply as additional funding is available
- Montgomery County resident
- ♣ Full-time student in Montgomery County school system
- Must be enrolled in the YouthWorks summer program to participate in other sessions

Has one or more of the following barriers:

- Basic skills deficient (low grades or behind a grade level)
- ♣ An English language learner
- ♣ A Justice System offender
- ♣ A homeless child/youth or a runaway
- 4 In foster care or has aged out of the foster care system
- Pregnant or parenting children
- ♣ A youth who is an individual with a disability
- Requires "Additional Assistance" to complete an education program or to secure/hold employment


