Dayton's Out on 5th is back! Out on 5th is the street closure of Fifth Street in downton Dayton's Oregon District from Patterson Boulevard to Wayne Avenue every Friday night through Sunday evening. So make plans to head to the Oregon District to safely shop, dine and relax in the open air!

The Oregon District is a "Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area," that allows patrons 21+ to purchase alcoholic beverages in a designated cup from permitted establishments and carry the beverages within a defined area. You can take your to-go beverage around the designated DORA, relaxing outdoors, or while you're shopping -- look for the DORA stickers on the entrances of participating retailers, and sip while you shop. Be sure to finish your DORA beverage before you enter another bar or restaurant.

Plan your visit to the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force for out of this world fun at their new Space Exhibit! This new interactive exhibit designed to spark imaginations by igniting the desire for space exploration and discovery, and inspire new generations of explorers to dream of the possibilities that lie ahead, will be on display at the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force through September 6. The exhibit, titled "SPACE: A Journey to Our Future," is being provided by Evergreen Exhibitions and allows visitors to experience explorations of the past as well as our future destiny in space. Highlights of the exhibit include touching actual rocks from the lunar surface of the moon and the red planet of Mars; exploring a Mars Base Camp while walking through a full-size habitat and work pod; taking a spin on a centrifuge that is powered like a bicycle; getting an up-close look at a wide range of artifacts from the space program; and looking into future explorations of the universe.

Note: COVID-19 safety precautions will include issuing gloves to each visitor interacting with the exhibit, as well as cleaning and sanitizing the exhibit throughout each day. Visitors ages three and up are required to wear masks during their visit to the museum.

The exhibit, which is located in the museum's fourth building, features content provided by NASA and the National Science Teachers Association, and introduces visitors to generations of dreamers and thinkers who have at times risked their lives to provide a better understanding of who we are and how we fit into the universe around us. Visitors will also meet today's explorers who are on the forefront of the search for answers to questions about the universe including how to protect it and what life exists out there.



Hi Everyone,

As part of the American Rescue Plan Act, the Shuttered Venue Operators Grant was created. Eligible applicants may qualify for grants equal to 45% of their gross earned revenue, with the maximum amount available to a single grant award of \$10 million. \$2 billion are reserved for eligible applications with up to 50 full time employees.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Eligible entities may be:

- Live venue operators or promoters
- Theatrical producers
- Live performing arts organization operators
- Museum operators
- Motion picture theater operators
- Talent representatives

In order to be eligible for the grant, a venue must have a defined performance and audience space and its **primary** business activity must one of the above entities.

Here are the **Eligibility Requirements** and **FAQs** distributed by the SBA to help you determine if you meet eligibility.

NOTE: Being a previous CARES Act funding recipient does NOT disqualify you from receiving these funds.

APPLICATION PROCESS:

Prior to applying for an SVOG an applicant must have:







Each video is roughly 20 minutes in length and walks you through how to set up your booth as well as how to interact with job seekers during the event itself.







Our understanding of the role the environment plays in shaping health has expanded immensely over the last few decades. A growing body of empirical data and evidence-based design research demonstrates that architecture impacts care delivery as well as health outcomes.
