Restaurant Revitalization Fund

This program provides emergency assistance for eligible restaurants, bars, and other qualifying businesses impacted by COVID-19.

The American Rescue Plan Act established the Restaurant Revitalization Fund (RRF) to provide funding to help restaurants and other eligible businesses keep their doors open. This program will provide restaurants with funding equal to their pandemic-related revenue loss up to \$10 million per business and no more than \$5 million per physical location. Recipients are not required to repay the funding as long as funds are used for eligible uses no later than March 11, 2023.

Who can apply?

Eligible entities who have experienced pandemic-related revenue loss include:

- Restaurants
- Food stands, food trucks, food carts
- Caterers
- Bars, saloons, lounges, taverns
- Snack and nonalcoholic beverage bars
- o Bakeries (onsite sales to the public comprise at least 33% of gross receipts)
- o Brewpubs, tasting rooms, taprooms (onsite sales to the public comprise at least 33% of gross receipts)
- o Breweries and/or microbreweries (onsite sales to the public comprise at least 33% of gross receipts)
- Wineries and distilleries (onsite sales to the public comprise at least 33% of gross receipts)
- o Inns (onsite sales of food and beverage to the public comprise at least 33% of gross receipts)
- Licensed facilities or premises of a beverage alcohol producer where the public may taste, sample, or purchase products

Allowable uses of funds

Funds may be used for specific expenses including:

- o Business payroll costs (including sick leave)
- Payments on any business mortgage obligation
- o Business rent payments (note: this does not include prepayment of rent)
- o Business debt service (both principal and interest; note: this does not include any prepayment of principal or interest)
- Business utility payments
- o Business maintenance expenses
- Construction of outdoor seating
- o Business supplies (including protective equipment and cleaning materials)
- Business food and beverage expenses (including raw materials)
- Covered supplier costs
- Business operating expenses

The SBA began accepting applications for the Restaurant Revitalization Fund (RRF) on Monday, May 3. In the <u>first two days of the RRF application window</u>, the SBA has received:

- 186,200 applications from restaurants, bars, and other eligible businesses in all 50 states, Washington, D.C., and five U.S. Territories.
- 97,600 applications of which came from restaurants, bars, and other eligible businesses owned and controlled by women (46,400), veterans (4,200), socially and economically disadvantaged individuals (30,800), or some combination of the three (16,200).
- 61,700 applications from businesses with under \$500,000 in annual prepandemic revenue, representing some of the smallest restaurants and bars in America.



Bad actors may take this opportunity to impersonate lenders or government officials in emails, robocalls, social media accounts and phony websites. Their goal is to attract victims and commit fraud, scams and schemes. The result is financial or personally identifiable information (PII) loss for the victims.

As a reminder, the SBA directly communicates from email addresses ending in **@sba.gov.** The SBA also communicates via email updates/notifications using an email marketing platform, (the same one you are receiving this newsletter from). Those emails end in **@updates.sba.gov**.

If you applied for the Shuttered Venue Operators Grant and emailed the SVOG Support Center, you may receive an email back from a **zendesk.com** account. This is an authorized SBA contractor.

If you are being contacted by someone claiming to be from the SBA who is not using an official SBA email address, you should suspect fraud. To report potential fraud, visit <u>sba.gov/covidfraudalert</u>.








I am the Riverway - Meet Lisa Smith Richards, owner of Chaffee's Brewhouse



Included among the more than 40 veterans scheduled to be on-hand will be crew chiefs; engineers; navigators; flight attendants; and pilots, along with an Aircraft Maintenance Quality Control Officer; Electronics Warfare Officer; Missile Combat Crew Commander/Instructor; Missile Crew Member; Navigator/Electronic Countermeasures Officer; Personal Equipment Specialist; Structural Repair Technician; Weapon System Officer; and Chaplain. In addition, a former museum curator will speak about the B-29 *Bockscar* and two presenters will be available to talk about the B-17 *Memphis Belle*.


