
Speaker Bios

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS: TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE COURSE

- Q: I can't come to both classes. Does this disqualify me from applying?
- **A:** Up to three people from your organization are invited to attend, and at least one of those attendees is required to attend both classes.
- Q: We already have a drug-free policy in place. Is there any use in me applying?
- A: Yes, especially if it has been more than a year since you have reviewed your policy/program. Many companies have policies in place that are not up-to-date against current law and trends (e.g., ADA, Ohio's medical marijuana law, H.B. 80, the new OSHA reporting law) impacting post-accident drug testing.
- Q: Our parent company owns several affiliate or sister companies. Will they each get a free policy?
- A: No. One drug-free workplace (DFWP) policy will be customized for one of your companies (defined by their unique BWC or federal tax I.D. number). Additional policies for affiliated companies can be purchased for a nominal fee.
- Q: Help me justify being out of the office for two days to attend this course.
- A: If you have an existing DFWP program in place or want to implement one, you will actually save time by coming to this course. The amount of time you would spend researching the subject matter, writing/revising a current and legally sound policy, consulting with subject-matter experts, locating and qualifying assistance providers, etc., is far greater than two days you will spend in class. (And doing it in a group of other businesses will be a lot more enjoyable, too!)
- Q: Some of our employees are members of a union. Can the program help us?
- A: Yes. Working Partners®, the company that developed and is facilitating the course, has extensive experience working with companies who are signatory to collective bargaining agreements.
- Q: Are there any costs associated with the Technical Assistance Course?
- A: No. The technical assistance course and the customized DFWP policy you will receive are free. In fact, the retail value of the course (including the customized policy) is over \$2,500 per company. Costs you might *choose*, but are *not required*, to incur are related to the implementation of your new policy/program (e.g., drug testing, employee education and supervisor training). Even these optional implementation costs may be off-set if participating companies opt to apply for rebates and grants offered in BWC's Drug-Free Safety Program.
- Q: If I'm not paying for the Technical Assistance Course, who is?
- A: The Working Partners® Drug-Free Workforce Community Initiative (DFWCI) including the Technical Assistance Course -- is funded, in part, by the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (OhioMHAS) and the Montgomery County ADAMHS Board.

USDA Rural Development Business & Cooperative Programs

Rural Development is pleased to announce important changes to the Business & Industry (B&I) Loan Guarantee Program. These changes will better serve rural communities by helping lenders provide loans to businesses and helping to increase employment opportunities for rural residents. These changes include but are not limited to:

- Removal of the U.S. Citizenship requirement for companies wanting to use the B&I loan guarantee to increase employment in rural areas. The applicant company will need to demonstrate the loan funds will remain in the United States and will be invested in the rural community to create and retain employment opportunities.
- Owner subordinated debt may be included as equity provided the debt was established in exchange for cash and the debt remains in the company for the life of the guaranteed loan. This change can help applicants meet the minimum tangible balance sheet equity requirements of the program. Minimum tangible balance sheet equity for an existing business is 10% while a startup business is 20%. All financial statements must be prepared according to Generally Accepted Accounting Principles.

- New Market Tax Credit projects are now be eligible for assistance through the B&I program. Subordinated debt made by the Community Development Entity can be considered as equity into a project. This is another means of helping the business meet the minimum tangible balance sheet equity requirements.
- The guarantee fee can be reduced to 1% of the guaranteed portion for businesses that support value added agriculture; promotes access to healthy foods; or is a high impact business development investment.
- Loan guarantees can for agricultural production can be 50% or \$5MM, whichever is less, of vertically integrated businesses. This is a substantial increase from the previous agricultural production maximum amount of \$1,000,000.


