

Dayton Foundation's Support for NonProfit Workshops



For nearly 50 years, Dayton SCORE has provided free business mentoring to local entrepreneurs, focusing mainly on for-profit businesses. In 2012, at the suggestion of Dayton Foundation staff, the organization began offering services to not-for-profit organizations as well.

Today, it provides training and free mentoring services for nonprofits on topics ranging from

board development to volunteer management.

When The Dayton Foundation approached us, they explained that many small nonprofits in our 11-county service area were failing due to a lack of fundamental business skills. They had few places to get help," said Robert Puskar, a SCORE volunteer. SCORE volunteers Wally Nugent, Bob Halstead, Arnold Sandness and others devoted several months to talking with local nonprofits to understand their needs. From those discussions, SCORE developed a series of workshops and expanded the team of volunteers to include face-to-face mentoring for nonprofit staff and board members.

Since the Fall of 2012 SCORE has conducted a series of six workshops twice a year, serving more than 2,500 people. The feedback we hear from workshop attendees and local nonprofit funders tells us this initiative is making a difference. We hope that our work will help Greater Dayton nonprofit organizations better serve their clients.
