

Good evening all,

We received additional information about Federal Disaster Recovery programs and wanted to share it with everyone.

As we mentioned in our last email, there are SBA Disaster Loans available for both residential loss and for businesses for damage resulting from the severe storms, straight-line winds, tornadoes, flooding and landslides on May 27 -29, 2019. Many businesses can apply for both physical and economic injury.

In order to apply for the SBA residential loans, you must first register with FEMA. Business are not required to register with FEMA, but it is recommended.

The site to do that is <u>DisasterAssistance.gov</u> or you can download the FEMA mobile app. If online or mobile access is unavailable, applicants should call the FEMA toll-free helpline at 800-621-3362. Those who use 711-Relay or Video Relay Services should call 800-621-3362.

To remind you, The disaster declaration covers:

- Primary counties Auglaize, Darke, Greene, Hocking, Mercer, Miami, Montgomery, Muskingum, Perry and Pickaway counties in Ohio.
 Businesses in these counties are eligible for both Physical and Economic Injury Disaster Loans from the SBA.
- Secondary Counties Allen, Athens, Butler, Champaign, Clark, Clinton, Coshocton, Fairfield, Fayette, Franklin, Guernsey, Hardin, Licking, Logan, Madison, Morgan, Noble, Preble, Ross, Shelby, Van Wert, Vinton and Warren in Ohio; and Adams, Jay, Randolph and Wayne in Indiana. Businesses and most nonprofit organizations in these counties are eligible to apply only for SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loans.


