Good evening all,

We received additional information about Federal Disaster Recovery programs and wanted to share it with everyone.

As we mentioned in our last email, there are SBA Disaster Loans available for both residential loss and for businesses for damage resulting from the severe storms, straight-line winds, tornadoes, flooding and landslides on May 27 -29, 2019. Many businesses can apply for both physical and economic injury.

In order to apply for the SBA residential loans, you must first register with FEMA. Business are not required to register with FEMA, but it is recommended.

The site to do that is **DisasterAssistance.gov** or you can download the FEMA mobile app. If online or mobile access is unavailable, applicants should call the FEMA toll-free helpline at 800-621-3362. Those who use 711-Relay or Video Relay Services should call 800-621-3362.

To remind you, The disaster declaration covers:

- **Primary counties** Auglaize, Darke, Greene, Hocking, Mercer, Miami, Montgomery, Muskingum, Perry and Pickaway counties in **Ohio**. Businesses in these counties are eligible for both Physical and Economic Injury Disaster Loans from the SBA.
- Secondary Counties Allen, Athens, Butler, Champaign, Clark, Clinton, Coshocton, Fairfield, Fayette, Franklin, Guernsey, Hardin, Licking, Logan, Madison, Morgan, Noble, Preble, Ross, Shelby, Van Wert, Vinton and Warren in Ohio; and Adams, Jay, Randolph and Wayne in Indiana. Businesses and most nonprofit organizations in these counties are eligible to apply only for SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loans.



May Brought Exciting Projects!

In the month of May our Board approved a loan to Fluffy Dog Properties, LLC. to purchase a building in Monroe, OH. The property will be occupied by EICK Global Stem Academy, LLC, a start-up preschool/daycare business which will open later this year. KeyBank is the Third Party Lender in this transaction.

Our Board also approved a \$529,000 SBA 504 loan to Ohio Production Paint & Assembly Corp for new construction and expansion of their business. The Company is located in Osgood and Osgood State Bank provided the Third Party loan for this project.

The SBA Is Offering Disaster Assistance After Storms and Tornadoes Smash Through the Region

According to Acting Administrator Chris Pilkerton, "Small businesses and most private nonprofit organizations in the following adjacent counties are eligible to apply only for SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loans: Allen, Athens, Butler, Champaign, Clark, Clinton, Coshocton, Fairfield, Fayette, Franklin, Guernsey, Hardin, Licking, Logan, Madison, Morgan, Noble, Preble, Ross, Shelby, Van Wert, Vinton and Warren in Ohio; and Adams, Jay, Randolph and Wayne in Indiana." There are other counties where BOTH physical damage AND Economic Injury loan assistance can be applied for. These were the counties primarily affected. These include Auglaize, Darke, Greene, Hocking, Mercer, Miami, Montgomery, Muskingum, Perry and Pickaway counties.



Need Help Marketing Your Products or Services Internationally?

The International Market Access Grant for Exporters (IMAGE) program helps small businesses increase exports and create jobs in Ohio's economy. The program reimburses at a 50% rate, capped at \$12,500 per eligible approved applicant. The IMAGE program is funded, in part, through the Small Business Administration's State Trade Expansion Program (STEP). USDA, Rural Development, Business & Industry Loan Guarantee Program has funding available for Fiscal Year 2019!

The USDA, Rural Development, Business & Industry Loan Guarantee Program can provide loan guarantees for the purpose of:

- Acquiring new businesses or expanding existing businesses;
- Purchasing and improving real estate;
- Purchasing machinery & equipment;

- refinancing outstanding debt; and
- providing term working capital.

Projects prioritized by headquarters are those projects intended to further enhance the rural economies by providing well-paying employment, essential community services and long term investments. These priority projects include:

- Broadband; high-speed internet connectivity.
- Commercially available unmanned technologies.
- Food distribution such as grocery stores and food manufacturing along with agritourism and biotechnology.
- Advancement of energy security by boosting production of energy from natural gas, oil, coal and renewables.
- A focus on "made in America" including projects for infrastructure, distribution, and value-chain participants.
- Projects that advance the quality of life. For example modern utilities, medical services, and for the treatment and recovery of opioid addiction.
- Advancement of career training and development.

The loan guarantee can be used to provide better rates and terms to the businesses you serve while reducing lender risk. In addition to reducing risk, the issuance of the loan guarantee can allow for additional fee income through the sale of the guaranteed portion on the secondary market.

Should there be an opportunity to consider financing one of these projects, please keep these programs in mind. There are guarantees of 80% for loans up to \$5,000,000; 70% for loans of \$5,000,000 - \$10,000,000, and 60% on loans over \$10,000,000.


