Shook Construction Company opens new headquarters

Springfield building to be turned into a mixed-use facility

- Myers Market, a historic Springfield building located at 101 S. Fountain Avenue, will be transformed into a mixed-use facility.
- Plans are to include a year-round farmers' market, a shared commercial kitchen, food hall, and coworking space.
- The joint effort between Spring Forward and COhatch is expected to cost around \$1.75 million and plans are to re-open the building in Spring 2019.

Matt Castrucci Auto Mall of Dayton purchases land

- The dealership purchased 37 acres near 490 Byers Road for \$5.1 million.
- The dealership has contacted Miamisburg city officials about a possible relocation to the land but no official plans have been submitted.

• The Matt Castrucci Auto Mall is currently located at 3103 Park Drive near the Dayton Mall.

New barbershop to open in Fairborn

- A&D Barber Shop signed a lease for space in the University Shoppes Shopping Center located at 2812 Colonel Glen Highway.
- Plans for renovations to the 1,600-square-foot space are not complete but they hope to begin within the next two to three weeks.
- This lease will put the University Shoppes at full occupancy.

Local retirement community sold

- Ohio Living, a non-profit senior housing provider based in Columbus, purchased the Quaker Heights Care Community located at 514 High Street in Waynesville.
- The 30-unit assisted living facility can serve around 158 residents.
- Plans are for the current management team to remain and the name will be changed to Ohio Living Quaker Heights.





Trade Mission to Thailand and Vietnam Development Services Agency and the Great Lakes St. Lawrence Governors and Premiers invite you to take part in a trade mission to Brazil and Columbia in March 2019. The goal of the mission is to help Ohio companies export products and services to these two important markets in South America.

Brazil is the eighth largest largest economy in the world and home to Latin America's largest aerospace, automotive, oil and gas, mining, capital goods, medical equipment and chemical industries. Brazil has a natural affinity for the U.S. and a high regard for U.S. products, brands, and technology.

Colombia is a smaller market but has the advantage of the U.S.-Colombia Free Trade Agreement which eliminates import tariffs on 80 percent of US exports of consumer and industrial products to Colombia. Colombia's infrastructure projects will generate demand for construction equipment for public roads and airports, transportation equipment, security and defense items and services, and mass transit systems.

If you are interested in the export potential of your product or service in Brazil or Colombia, reach out to us. STEP is funded through the Small **Business Administration's** (SBA) Office of International Trade, which provides guidance on the IMAGE grant that offers financial assistance for small businesses to promote their products and services in international markets. The grant will provide a 50 percent reimbursement up to \$12,500 per fiscal year for qualifying activities.

Grant Program Encourages Use of Recycled Products

Grant funds of \$50,000 available to local schools and non-profits



Dayton, Ohio (September 11, 2018) – In 2018, the Montgomery County Solid Waste District will offer \$50,000 in grant funding to promote the purchase of recycled-content products and to increase participation in the district's community and education programs.

Montgomery County Solid Waste District Buy Recycled Grants are available on a competitive basis to all Montgomery County schools and 501(c)3 designated non-profit agencies. Funding may be used to purchase and promote any type of recycled content material, such as paper, plastic, steel,

aluminum, tires and glass.

"The Buy Recycled Grant program enables local schools and non-profit agencies to invest in recycling and recycled-content products, which cuts down our community's reliance on landfills," said Debbie Lieberman, president of the Montgomery County Board of County Commissioners. "We encourage and support green business practices, which make our community more attractive and sustainable for citizens and business leaders."
