

Save Money on Your Energy Bills



The U. S. Department of Energy (DOE) recently announced \$60 million in funding for its Industrial Assessment Centers (IACs) to improve manufacturing efficiency and reduce carbon footprints. This effort will support the journey to achieving net-zero emissions by 2050, a Biden administration goal.

Founded in 1976, there are currently 32 IACs within universities across the United States, each with the goal of training students in order to address the growing shortage of energy-engineering professionals, while also providing free efficiency improvement recommendations to small and medium-sized manufacturers.

As the only IAC in the state of Ohio, the University of Dayton IAC will receive almost \$2 million of the grant funding, to continue to provide free energy assessments to small and mid-size manufacturers and train the next generation of energy-engineering professionals.

The University of Dayton (UD) IAC, established in 1981, has helped more than 1,000 manufacturers, who typically save an average of 10-15% of their total energy costs. The energy assessments are completed in a one-day visit from UD's IAC team, made up of faculty, staff and professionally trained students.

"We will examine your utility bills, facilities, equipment, manufacturing processes and waste streams," said Jun-Ki Choi, director of the UD Industrial Assessment Center and associate professor of mechanical and aerospace engineering. "Within six weeks an easy-to-read, confidential report will be delivered documenting current practices and recommending ways to save money. The report is an independent assessment of your facility needs and is not biased by the desire to generate sales or consulting opportunities."






Columbus Chapter who is the new District Director.


